

Since 1918, the legacy of John Huntington has been helping to fuel the growth and vibrancy of the Cleveland community through supporting the educational pursuits of rising generations. Through grants awarded to local colleges, universities and vocational training programs, The John Huntington Fund for Education provides scholarships for students entering STEM and Vocational related fields in the Cleveland area.

The John Huntington Fund for Education scholars program provides up to 50 CSPN students annually with an educational scholarship to offset the cost of tuition. The scholarship program provides up to \$2000.00 to each student. Students are selected based on the following criteria:

- Resides within Cuyahoga County
- Full-time enrollment at Central School of Practical Nursing
- The Student is in good academic standing (incoming students are eligible to apply)
- The Student is starting in Class 186 (September 2024) or a subsequent class unless notified otherwise.
- The student is NOT receiving a scholarship through a UH Earn and Learn program

**Application process:** Interested applicants are asked to provide a short paragraph (no more than 500 words) on one of the following topics:

"How is nursing going to change my life?"

Or

"What kind of nurse do I want to be?"

The application should include the student's full name, email address, phone number and short paragraph. The essay can be sent to <a href="https://doi.org/10.1007/journal.org/10.1007/jou
